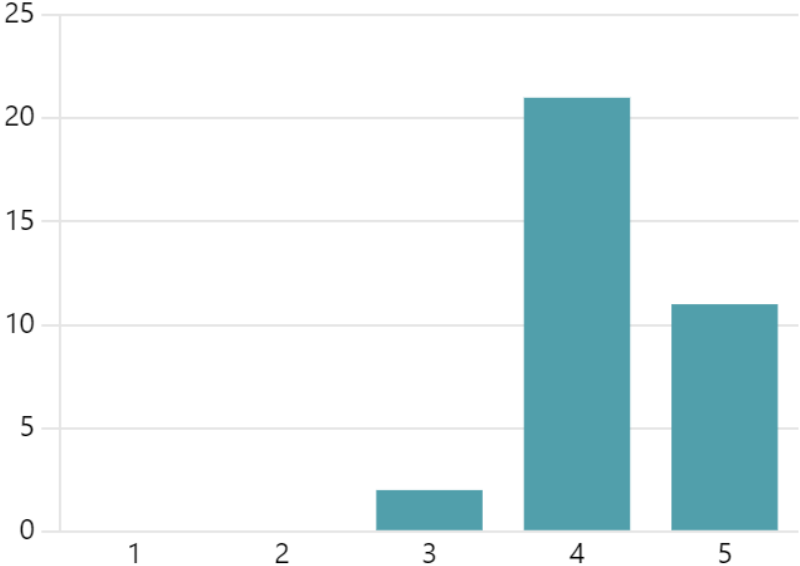

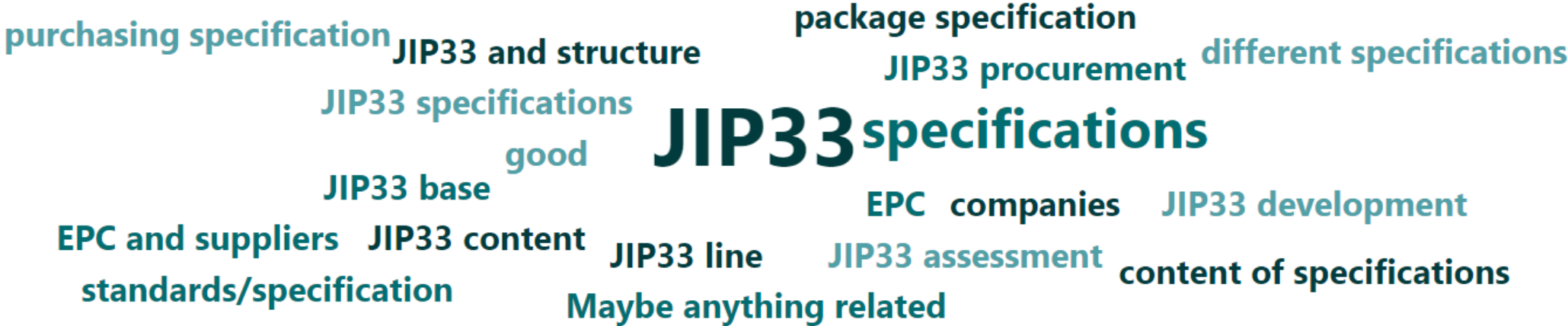

1	No all very relevant.
2	I think an initial pre-read or online webinar on the basics of JIP33 procurement specifications and their use case would have been good. There were too many people asking questions that didn't understand the fundamental principles.
3	Complexity of JIP33 specifications compared to operating companies already existing specifications.
4	An industry view on establishing, maintaining, adopting and implementing a suite of standards/specification; where JIP33 is one of these
5	Less of company presentations, more of actual JIP33 content presentations. More of the breakout sessions could have been part of the main event.
6	More about the cost for develop and maintain the specifications
7	I think the content was good. Maybe some of the companies could have presented a bit more on how they use the datasheets. How the EPC and suppliers can detect changes. Hence what will be the company "master setup" for some typical equipment.
8	Maybe more insight discussions, panels about optimal way ahead. How to endorse JIP33 in all levels of contracts. Maybe anything related to deviations to JIP33, how to handle them.

15	The presented topics was a good mix with relevant information and relevant experiences.

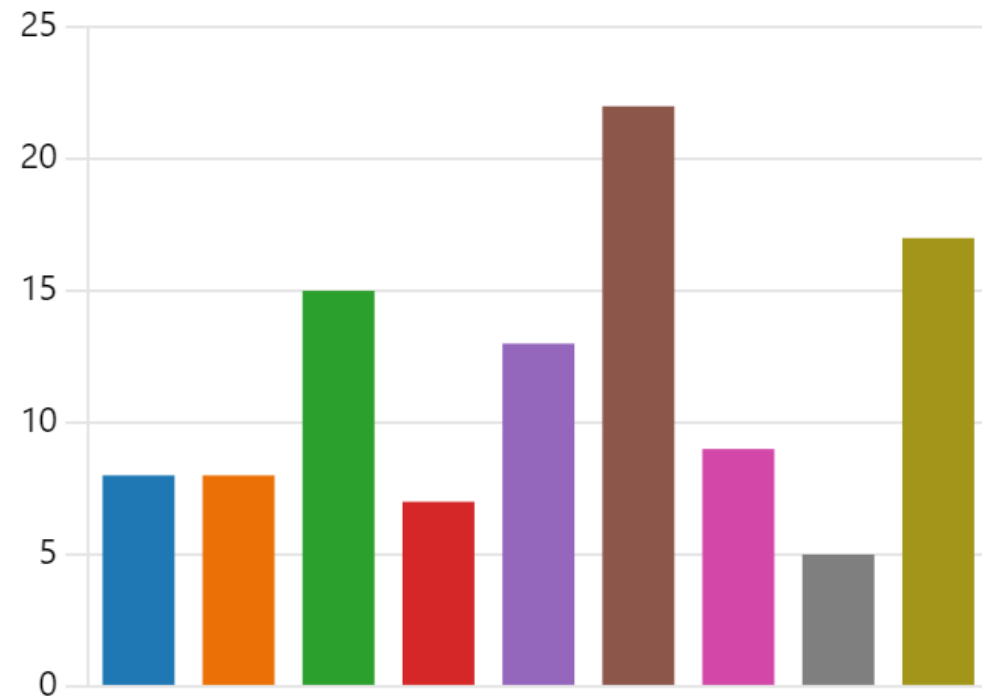

19	As overlay was continuous mentioned, more information from operators and EPC of ownership to the different specifications.
20	OPCOs reasons for including overlays on top of JIP33 base specs
21	Not really, but as a supplier to EPCs, I would have liked to see more focus on what's actually being done at EPC level to prevent what all suppliers presenting their experience was referring to: that EPCs are adding layers and layers of additional specific requirements that comes on top of the OpCo requirements. It does not matter if OpCo's are adhering to the "JIP33 line of thought" if EPCs are adding and adding requirements to cover their backs.

23	All covered, good and transparent insight on the implementation process
24	1) Supplier selection: specifications may be "standardized" but the key to a successful project execution is peace of mind with the supply chain. Project execution should also take into account any improvement opportunities that a skilled manufacturer can bring to the table. Improvements can be simple no brainers or in case of serious challenges also a bespoke solution. Focus shall always remain on the best and simplest solution. Proven capability (JIP33 assessment / certification) and the products overall value (life cycle costs) should prevail and determine supplier selection. 2) Additive manufacturing

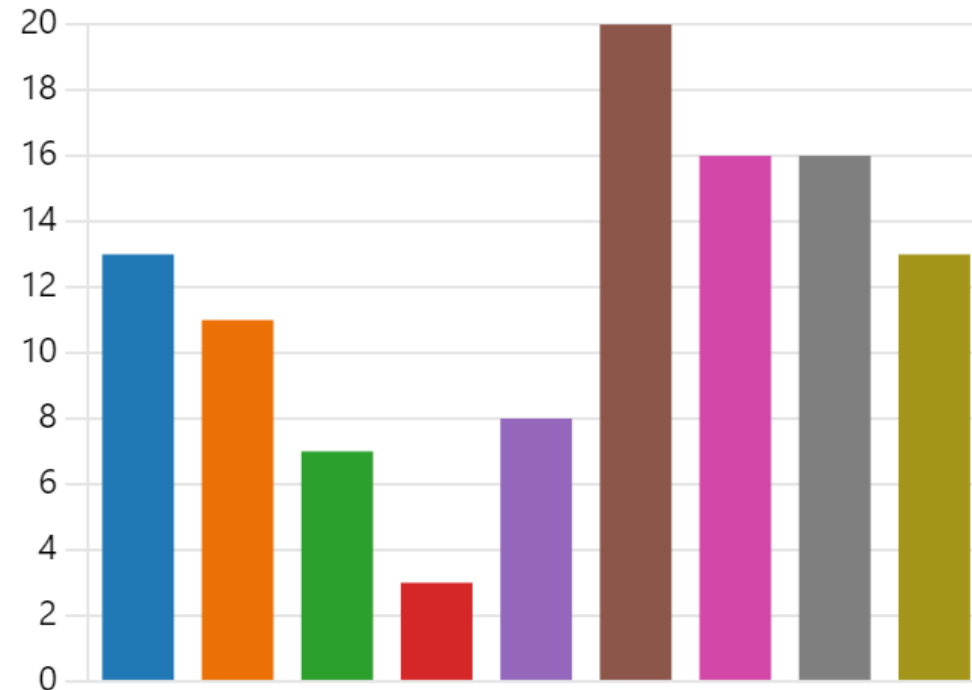

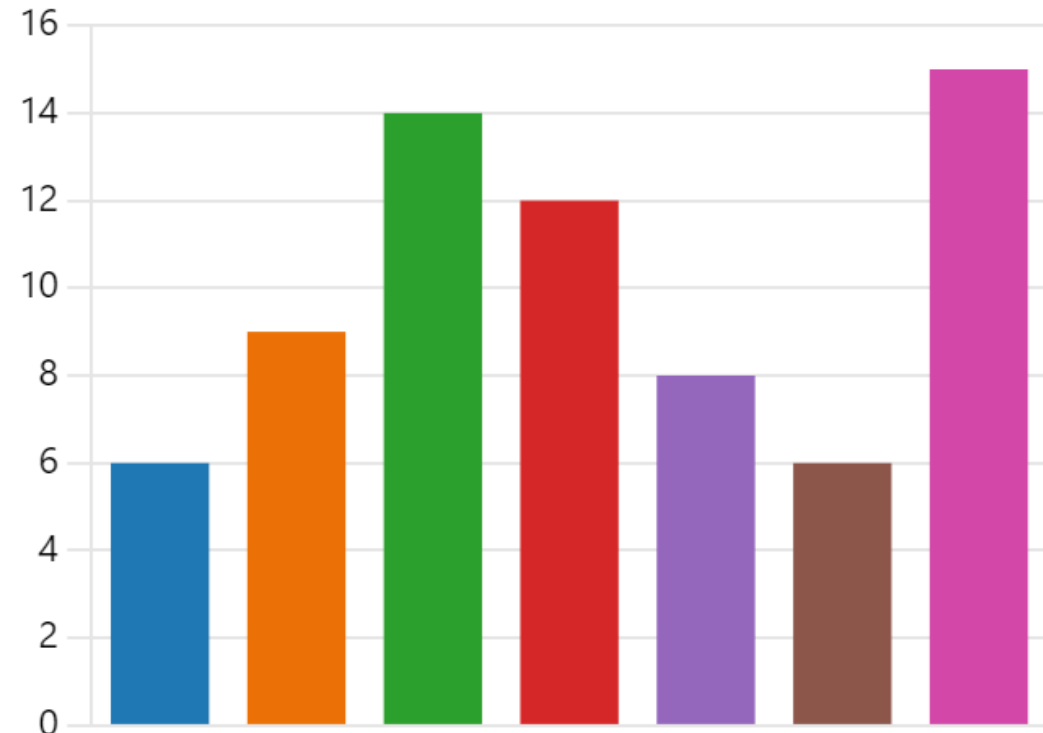

I got that impression from one of the key IOGP persons at the event. That may have not have been communicated very well..

19	Digital Transformation, Climate Change, Sustainability and ESG, Geopolitical Risk are the macroeconomic megatrends that are shaping the Oil & Gas industry, and they have a huge impact on our activities as an equipment manufacturer. They are challenges we have to detect before they become a new requirement. We would like a more detailed insight about equipment procurement trends: less manual valves and more actuated valves? what type of technologies are you looking for? what should these technologies do for your projects?

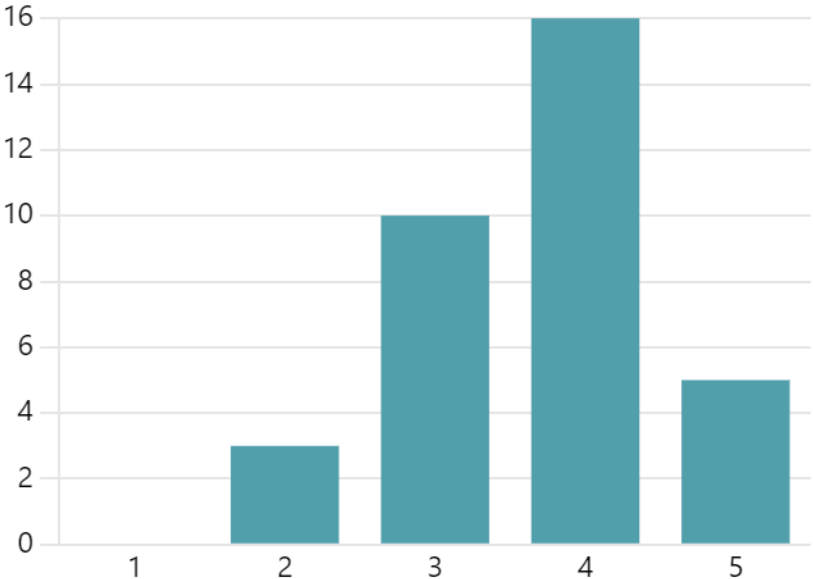
To what extent do you feel you expanded your network beyond your business cluster during this summit?
